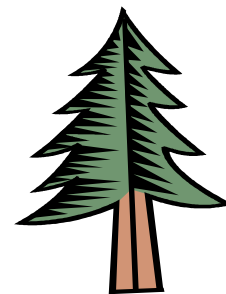

Worth, TX**

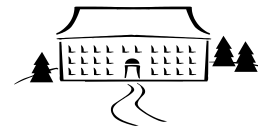
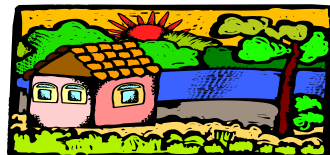

MN JCI SENATE SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

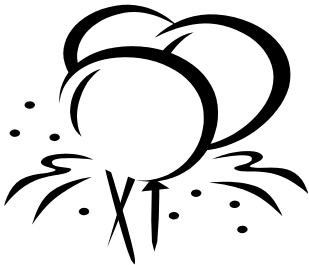
